

Challenge yourself to become a leader in the outdoors. You'll build on your technical skills with a choice of strands in Abseil, Bush, Rock, High Ropes, Sea Kayaking and Flatwater Kayaking. You will also be introduced to planning, preparing and leading outdoor activities.

You will be under the supervision of experienced outdoor education tutors as you learn and develop skills in the Outdoors.



The programme can be delivered fulltime over 20 weeks or part time over the year. Students will visit outdoor learning locations for their training such as Mt Taranaki, Waitara & Waiwhakaiho Rivers, Wharepapa South and / or other areas with their outdoor tutors.
